



The Dunhill Medical Trust is a member of a consortium of UK biomedical and health research funders that contribute to the funding of UK PubMed Central (UKPMC), with the intention of ensuring that the complete versions of publications derived from DMT-funded research are freely available. (see <http://ukpmc.ac.uk/Funders> for guiding principles).

The UKPMC service will ensure that papers deposited are freely available, fully searchable and extensively linked to other online resources for the benefit of researchers funded by The Dunhill Medical Trust. It will also enable DMT to have full access to details of publications arising from the work it funds.

- (1) It is a condition of all research and research-related grants funded by DMT that the Trust is informed when a manuscript is accepted for publication. A copy of the final manuscript of all peer-reviewed papers supported in whole or in part by a DMT grant must be deposited in an open access archive such as PubMed Central (PMC) or UKPMC, to be made freely available within six months of publication.
- (2) Where required to ensure open access, DMT will provide the names and contact details of grant holders to third parties in connection with the administration of the UKPMC database and website, and they may contact grant holders directly for such purposes.
- (3) Most journals will deposit the article on behalf of the authors directly into PMC or UKPMC, to become available on publication, or after an embargo period. In some cases, journals will not deposit the article, but will allow the authors to deposit a copy themselves via an author manuscript submission system. - (4) All DMT grant holders submitting manuscripts to journals should first check whether the publisher supports open access and how they can comply with paragraph (1) above. Useful information on which publishers are compliant with DMT's open access policy can be found on the SHERPA/RoMEO website at <http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo.php>.
- (5) DMT will provide a contribution towards the valid costs of open access fees levied by publishers who support the open access model, but demand payment to allow manuscripts to become available in UKPMC within six months of the publisher's official date of final publication. The funding provided will be in the form of a one-off sum that will be added to the grant awarded by DMT and the amount will be on a sliding scale dependent on the size of the grant, i.e.:

Grants up to £50,000	£1,000
Grants from £50,000 to £100,000	£2,000
Grants over £100,000	£3,000

note: Applicants are not required to apply for this funding. It will be automatically added to all research project and programme grants awarded by DMT. Grant holders will however be expected to account in their final report for their use of the funding provided and will be required to provide evidence that publications arising from the work funded are available on open access site(s).
